Helpful Hints

Still Life: Create a detailed still life composition featuring red chili peppers along with other complementary objects like garlic, tomatoes, or herbs.

Abstract Art: Use the vibrant red color of chili peppers to create abstract pieces that play with shapes, lines, and textures.

Cultural Representation: Illustrate how red chili peppers are used in different cultures, such as in traditional dishes, markets, or festivals.

Botanical Illustration: Focus on the intricate details of chili peppers, capturing their texture, shape, and color in a realistic style.

Fantasy Scenes: Incorporate red chili peppers into imaginative and fantastical scenes, such as a chili pepper forest or a mythical creature made of peppers.

Photography Ideas

Macro Photography: Capture close-up shots of red chili peppers to highlight their texture and vibrant color.

Chili Pepper in Nature: Photograph chili peppers growing in a garden or farm setting, showing their natural environment.

General Rules

No Business Cards: Business cards are not allowed on any entries.

Framing Requirements: Artwork must be framed and ready to hang with heavy gauge picture wire. No glue or tape of any kind can be used. Canvas paintings not framed must have a wire screwed into the frame.

Content Restrictions: Due to the family atmosphere of the Fair, artwork deemed inappropriate or containing nudity will not be accepted.

Liability: The Pima County Fair and its agents assume no responsibility for loss, theft, or damage to any artwork during drop-off, display, pickup, or storage. Every precaution will be taken to guard against such loss or damage.

Original Work: Entries must be from an individual artist. All artwork previously submitted to the Pima County Fair is prohibited.

Size and Weight Limits: Entries cannot exceed 36 inches in any dimension or weigh more than 50 pounds.

Classification: Exhibitors are responsible for determining which class and division they wish to compete in. Improperly classified entries could be disqualified with no entry fee refund given.

Judging: Judging is closed to the public and all decisions are final.

Collection of Items: Due to lack of storage, items not collected within 2 weeks after the Fair will be donated or removed from the Fairgrounds.

Premiums/Cash Prizes: Premiums and cash prizes will be paid to the artist during the Fair or at the pickup of artwork. Cash vouchers must be redeemed no later than Tuesday, April 29, 2025.

Copyright Infringement: Copying work done by other artists is an infringement of copyright law, including other's photographs.

Glass Cases: We have limited glass cases available. Please call ahead and talk to Julia Casillas, the Competitive Entries Manager, at (520)762-9106 to check availability.

Criteria for Awards

Best of Show:

Overall Impact: The artwork's ability to engage and captivate the viewer. **Creativity and Originality:** Unique approach and innovative techniques.

Technical Skill: Mastery of the medium and attention to detail.

Adherence to Theme: How well the artwork aligns with the given theme,

"Sunset on the Range: The Life of Cowboys and Cowgirls."

Composition and Design: Effective use of elements such as color, line,

shape, and space.

People's Choice:

Public Appeal: The artwork that receives the most votes from fair attendees. **Engagement:** How well the artwork resonates with and attracts the audience.

Emotional Impact: The ability to evoke emotions and connect with viewers on a personal level. These criteria help ensure that the awards recognize both technical excellence and public appreciation.

If a class has more than 30 entries, it will be judged as a group. Judges won't give out ribbons unless the entry is deemed worthy. They will use the American System for judging, and their decisions are final. Judges will look for originality, quality of work, composition, and presentation.

Drop off Artwork

Sale of Artwork

The Pima County Fair allows artists to sell their artwork at the Fair. Here are the key points:

Prices must be fixed, no ranges or negotiations.

Buyers must fill out a purchase form and pay the Entries Manager.

The Fair takes a 20% commission from the sale.

The remaining amount will be given to the artist either on entry release days or within 30 days after the Fair ends.

Buyers can now pick up their purchased artwork during the Fair and take it with them.

The Entries Manager is responsible for distributing the artwork.

Division Definitions

PROFESSIONAL

For artists working at a professional level. This includes those who teach or have taught art, participate in gallery exhibits or juried shows, and sell their work through stores, galleries, or arts & crafts fairs.

AMATEUR

For students or hobbyists who have never sold their artwork, except through the Fine Arts Department at the Pima County Fair.

SENIOR

For artists who are 55 years old or older.

Frequently Asked Questions

Who are the judges?

Judges are selected based on their experience in the relevant category.

How does judging work?

Judging is closed to the public.

Entries will be judged after they have been received and displayed.

Judging will follow the American Judging System, and all decisions are final.

When will the pieces need to be delivered to the Fair?

Exhibitors are responsible for delivering their artwork to the Fairgrounds on:

Friday, April 11, 2025, from 3pm to 6pm

Saturday, April 12, 2025, from 10am to 4pm

Is my entry considered Fine Art or Home Art?

Fine Art: Visual art created primarily for aesthetic and intellectual purposes, judged for its beauty and meaningfulness. The artwork must demonstrate originality, artistic technique, and quality execution.

Home Art: Functional art, applied arts, crafts, and related items.

What are the requirements for my art exhibit?

Entries must not be larger than 36 inches in any dimension or weigh more than 50 pounds.

All artwork must be framed and wired, or if unable to frame, must have wire to hang.

How many pieces am I allowed to enter each year?

Each artist may enter a maximum of five pieces within each class.

Artists may not exceed a total of 30 items entered.

Where is my entry displayed?

The Fine Art Gallery is located at the Old Pueblo Conference and Event Center, down the hall on the right.

How will I know if I won an award or sold my piece?

Entries that have placed or received honorable mention will be displayed with the appropriate ribbon.

If your piece has been sold, you will be contacted by the Competitive Entries Manager.
