Creative Ideas for Egg Art/Coloring Contest

Barnyard Scene: Paint a classic red barn with a few farm animals like cows, goats, chickens, and pigs around it. Add some green grass and a blue sky to complete the scene.

Animal Portraits: Focus on detailed portraits of individual farm animals. You could paint a series of eggs, each featuring a different animal like a cow, goat, sheep, or horse.

Farm Landscape: Create a panoramic farm landscape across multiple eggs. Each egg could depict a different part of the farm, such as fields, a farmhouse, a pond, and a barn.

Vintage Farm Signs: Paint eggs to look like vintage farm signs. Use rustic colors and fonts to create signs that say things like "Farm Fresh Eggs," "Dairy Farm," or "Goat Milk."

Farm Life: Illustrate scenes of daily farm life, such as milking cows, feeding chickens, or harvesting crops. These can be simple yet charming depictions of farm activities.

Farm Animal Families: Paint eggs featuring farm animal families, like a mother hen with her chicks, a cow with her calf, or a goat with her kids. This can add a heartwarming touch to your artwork.

Seasonal Farm: Depict the farm in different seasons. You could have one egg showing a springtime scene with blooming flowers, another with a summer harvest, an autumn egg with falling leaves, and a winter egg with snow-covered barns.

Farm Tools and Equipment: Paint eggs with images of traditional farm tools and equipment, such as tractors, plows, pitchforks, and watering cans. This can give a rustic and authentic feel to your collection.

Farm Produce: Showcase the bounty of the farm by painting eggs with images of fresh produce like corn, pumpkins, apples, and carrots. This can highlight the farm-to-table theme.

Whimsical Farm: Add a touch of whimsy by painting farm animals in fun and unexpected ways, like a cow wearing sunglasses, a goat with a flower crown, or chickens having a tea party.

"We strongly recommend blowing out all eggs, as they will be on display for 11 days during the Fair. Alternatively, you can use other craft materials for decoration, as listed below."

Drained (Blown Out) Eggs

Here is what to do to drain eggs

Wash the Egg: Clean the egg with soap and water.

Poke Holes: Use a pin or needle to poke a small hole at each end of the egg. **Blow Out the Contents:** Hold the egg over a bowl and blow through one hole to expel the contents through the other hole.

Rinse and Dry: Rinse the inside of the egg with water and let it dry completely. There are plenty of materials you can use for egg-shaped crafts! Here are some ideas:

Alternatives

Styrofoam: Easy to shape and decorate with paint, fabric, or other embellishments.

Clay: Moldable and can be painted once dry.

Plastic Eggs: Often used for Easter, these can be painted, glued, and

decorated.

Fabric: Covering eggs with fabric scraps can create a unique texture and look.

Felt: Soft and easy to cut into shapes for decorating.

Paper Mache: Great for creating sturdy, paintable eggs.

Cardboard: Cut out egg shapes and decorate with markers, paint, or collage materials.

Wood: Wooden eggs can be painted and decorated for a more durable craft.

Ideas to help you get started

Scarecrow Building: Create scarecrows using various materials like old clothes, straw, and sticks. Students can personalize their scarecrows with hats, scarves, and other accessories.
