RULES AND REGULATIONS:

These shows are sanctioned by the American Dairy Goat Association and their rules shall govern. The Junior and Senior Shows are separately sanctioned. These shows are open to all ADGA, AGS, and CGS registered does. No AGS paperwork will be signed. The original registration paper or **stamped duplicate (per current ADGA rules)** is required for all entries. All animals must be tattooed prior to entering the ring.

HEALTH RULES: Arizona law requires that all animals be properly identified (tattooed) and listed on a self-inspection form. Include your Scrapie Premise ID at the designated place on your entry form. Make sure ALL your animals are correctly tattooed before coming to the fair. Unless animal numbers require use of Ramada for show animals, all animals being shown must be penned in the show barn. As necessary, non-show animals will be penned in horse stalls in the Ramada. The fair veterinarian inspects all livestock daily. **PLEASE DON'T BRING ANIMALS TO THE FAIR WHO SHOW ANY SIGNS OF PINKEYE, SKIN LESIONS, NASAL DISCHARGE, OR DIARRHEA.** The decision of a licensed veterinarian, along with the barn superintendent, will be final. Any animal so identified **and herdmates MUST** be removed immediately from the barn.

OUT OF STATE exhibitors must obtain a permit to enter the state. This can be obtained from the State Veterinarian's office at 1802 W Jackson, 78 Phoenix, AZ 85007. Telephone (602) 542-4293. Obtain Health Certificate prior to requesting State Entry Permit.

EXHIBITOR PASSES AND PARKING:

Exhibitor passes **MUST** be paid with a separate check (payable to **Southwestern Fair Commission**) and sent in with your entries **BY MARCH 13, 2026**. Every person needing to exit and re-enter the fairgrounds must have an exhibitor pass. Adults **\$25.00**, children 6-12, **\$10.00**, under six no charge. Each exhibitor will receive one parking pass. Extra parking passes **\$20.00 each**. limit of 2. Additional parking passes should be indicated on the entry form and paid for along with your exhibitor's passes. Passes are good for all 11 days of the fair.

DRESS CODE: Pima County Fair realizes the focus is on your doe, but your appearance in the show ring projects an image to the fair management, the public, the media and your fellow dairy goat exhibitors. We would like you to help us put on a first-rate show. Please take as much care with your personal appearance and that of your helpers as you do with your dairy goats.

All people entering the show ring handling dairy goats in any classes are expected to be dressed in the following manner:

- Clean white shirt
- Clean long (below the knee) white or black pants or skirts
- Closed toe shoes

The following attire is **NOT** acceptable

- Tank tops, muscle shirts, halter tops, bare midriffs, spaghetti straps, tube tops and see-through, fish net, or any other transparent clothing
- Shorts of any kind

PREMIUMS:

Exhibitors will be eligible for two (2) premiums per class. Premiums will be paid through 4th place as follows: \$35, \$30, \$25, \$20. Udder classes will be paid as follows: \$6, \$4, \$2. **Best in Show Jr. Doe, Best in Show Sr. Doe, Best Udder in Show: \$100.00** Any exhibitor leaving prior to official release will forfeit premiums.

ENTRY FEES:

\$10.00 PER ENTRY and \$6.00 per group class. NO REFUNDS! ENTRY FEES MUST ACCOMPANY ENTRY FORMS AND ARE PAYABLE TO PIMA COUNTY FAIR. ENTRIES MUST BE POSTMARKED BY MARCH 13, 2026.

Note: Late entries of kids born March 13 – March 31, 2026, will be accepted if postmarked by April 3, 2026, or emailed by April 6, 2026. Please include your e-mail address and indicate if you wish to receive verification of your entries. We are not responsible for entries that do not arrive due to mail service. LATE ENTRIES (except for entries of kids born March 13 - March 31, 2026, as stated above) WILL BE ASSESSED A LATE FEE OF \$25.00/ EXHIBITOR. ENTRIES RECEIVED WITHOUT PAYMENT WILL BE ASSESSED A LATE FEE OF \$25.00/ EXHIBITOR. NO EXCEPTIONS.

NON-SHOW KIDS. Nursing or bottle-fed kids of either sex that you do not intend to show may be entered on the NON-SHOW ENTRY FORM. Per Arizona law, these animals MUST be individually identified by tattoo or ear tag and listed on your self-inspection form (in-state) or interstate health papers (if out-of-state.). These animals will be penned in horse stalls in the Ramada area east of the show barn, OR (if space available) in separate pens in show barn. Fees will be \$5.00 /head plus pen fees (\$10.00/stall.)

PENNING:

Please figure approximately 3-4 standard adult goats per pen and 4-6 kids or Nigerian Dwarf adults per pen!!! Pen space in the show barn MAY NOT be provided for animals not entered in the show!!! See above for bringing non-show animals. Pens will be available on a first-requested basis. If you request more pens than your animal entries require, your pen numbers may be reduced at the superintendent's discretion.

PEN FEES:

\$5.00 PER PEN, INCLUDING TACK PENS, \$10.00/pen for non-show pens if available.

NO BEDDING IS PROVIDED!! Hay, grain and straw will be available for purchase and may be pre-ordered by calling the livestock superintendent at 520-425-3838

Animals must be in place by 6:00 PM Thursday, April 16, 2026.
