CONTEST PROGRAM GOAL FOR TEACHERS & STUDENTS

The goal of this program is to help students view the desert not as empty, but as vibrant and full of life, color, and meaning. Through their artwork, students are encouraged to highlight both well-known places and the often-overlooked details—like a lizard under a rock, the patterns in canyon walls, or the quiet stillness before a monsoon.

This project invites students to reflect on their personal connection to Arizona—its landscapes, people, culture, and colors—and to express that connection creatively. Whether through painting, drawing, collage, or mixed media, students will explore what Arizona means to them and shares their unique perspective with the community.

Contest Ideas to Help You and Your Students Get Started

Creative Art Option: "A is for Arizona"

Design the letter "A" as your personal symbol for Arizona!

Use paint, collage, drawing, or sculpture to turn the letter "A" into a celebration of the desert's beauty, culture, and hidden treasures.

Fun Ideas:

- Fill the "A" with Arizona images: cacti, sunsets, animals, or your favorite place
- Use textures: foil for copper, sandpaper for trails, or yarn for desert paths
- Turn it into a treasure box: include the **5 Cs of Arizona** (Copper, Cattle, Cotton, Citrus, and Climate).
- Hide desert surprises inside—bones, roots, fossils, or creatures!
- Show desert life: day vs. night or above vs. underground.

What to Think About:

- What makes Arizona special to you?
- What stories or secrets does the desert hold?
- What do people miss when they don't look closely?

- All ages and skill levels.

Contest Ideas to Help You and Your Students Get Started

Sunset Silhouettes – Paint a desert sunset with warm colors, then add cactus or animal silhouettes using black paper or paint.

Saguaro Selfies – Draw a big saguaro cactus and decorate it with personal touches, like arms holding things you love.

Desert Texture Rubbings – Use items like leaves, rocks, or sandpaper to make textured desert landscape art.

Wildlife Close-Ups – Focus on animals like the javelina, roadrunner, Gila monster, or cactus wren using pastels, paint, or collage.

Animal Tracks Art – Draw or stamp footprints with labels and fun facts about each animal.

Grand Canyon Layers – Use torn paper or watercolors to show the colorful rock layers of the canyon.

Antelope Canyon Flow Art – Create swirling rock patterns using brush or finger painting.

Cave Explorers – Draw an imaginary scene deep inside Kartchner Caverns.

Petroglyph Scratch Art – Use crayons and scratching tools on black paper to mimic ancient rock art.

Cowboy Collages – Combine rope, denim, or bandana fabric into fun Western-themed mixed media art.

Basket Weaving Art – Try paper weaving inspired by Tohono O'odham or Hopi basket designs.

Monsoon Madness – Paint a stormy desert scene with clouds, lightning, and rain using watercolor or sponges.

Day & Night Desert - Split a page in half to show the desert during the day vs. nighttime.

Starry Sky Mandalas – Inspired by Native astronomy, make circular art representing the night sky.

Favorite Local Spot – Draw or paint your favorite place in Arizona—maybe a park, mountain, or even grandma's backyard!

Arizona Foods – Illustrate or sculpt local favorites like prickly pear candy, tamales, tortillas, or fry bread.

"I Am Arizona" Collage – Create a self-portrait surrounded by images that reflect your Arizona life.

Cash Awards: Cash awards will be given as cash vouchers. Teachers must collect these vouchers from the information desk and cash them at the Fair Office Cashier Window as soon as they are issued.

Cash vouchers must be redeemed no later than Monday, April 27, 2026.

Award Criteria:

Ribbons will only be awarded if the entry meets a standard of quality as determined by the judge. An entry must be deemed worthy to receive an award.

Judging System:

We use the Danish Judging System, where each entry is evaluated individually based on merit rather than in direct competition with others. All judging decisions are final.

Types of Judging:

Merit-Based Judging: Each piece is judged on its own merits according to set standards.

Competitive Judging: Only entries selected for Best of Class, Best of Show, Contests and People's Choice will be compared against other entries.

Best of Class Guidelines:

15 or More Entries: Eligible for Best of Class award with a monetary prize. 3 to 14 Entries: May be awarded Best of Class title, without a monetary prize.

Fewer than 3 Entries: Not eligible for Best of Class recognition.

This approach ensures that high-quality work is acknowledged in all categories while reserving prize funds for larger, more competitive divisions.

DROP OFF ARTWORK
